1. Project Background

The concept of AUN/SEED-Net evolved at the ASEAN-Japan Summit Meeting held in December 1997, at the time of Asian financial crisis and economic downturn that had struck the region, particularly the growing economies in Southeast Asia. The central issue of the Meeting became how to upgrade higher engineering education by means of creating network of ASEAN-wide engineering education initiative. As a result of a series of discussions and preparations between ASEAN Member Countries and Japan, the ASEAN University Network/Southeast Asia Engineering Education Development Network (AUN/SEED-Net) was established in 2001 as a sub-network of ASEAN University Network (AUN).

After two years of preparation, full-scale operation started in March 2003 for five years as the Phase 1 cooperation, which was then followed by Phase 2 and 3 of the five-year project cooperation. The Project Phase 3 ends in March 2018. The network of AUN/SEED-Net consists of 26 Member Institutions (MIs) from 10 ASEAN countries and academic support from 14 leading Japanese Supporting Universities (JSUs) with financial and technical supports from Japanese Government through Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

With the remarkable achievements in Phase 1, 2, and 3, the ASEAN Member Countries, MIs, Government of Japan and JICA have strong intention to put forth the AUN/SEED-Net Phase 4 with aims to bring about larger impacts not only on other universities in the region and Japan, but also industry and community by fostering direct contribution to socio-economic development in the region and Japan. After a series of discussions, the objectives of AUN/SEED-Net Project Phase 4 are set as follows;

- (1) To enhance education and research capacity of Member Institutions through collaboration among Member Universities in ASEAN and Japan
- (2) To strengthen capacity of Member Institutions to collaborate with industry
- (3) To address development issues in the region
- (4) To improve quality of international education program by advancing and expanding academic network

2. Program Concept

It is essential for AUN/SEED-Net students to conduct high quality doctoral thesis research of international standard. The research themes/topics will be carried out by AUN/SEED-Net students under joint supervision of Host Institutions and Japanese Supporting Universities. During the period of scholarship, students in the Doctoral Degree Sandwich Program and Integrated Graduate Program can visit their JSU co-advisors to receive thesis research supervision.

3. Objectives

- (1) To increase the number of highly qualified faculty staff with doctoral degree in engineering at Member Institutions which would be necessary for contribution to sustainable development of ASEAN countries.
- (2) To strengthen doctoral degree programs at Host Institutions so that the production of highly qualified doctoral degree holders in engineering needed for the ASEAN countries is materialized in collaboration with Member Institutions and Japanese Supporting Universities.
- (3) To strengthen human networking among teaching staff of Member Institutions and Japanese Supporting Universities.

4. Applicant Eligibility

Doctoral Degree Sandwich students and Integrated Graduate students of AUN/SEED-Net who are in good health conditions. Those with following health conditions must inform AUN/SEED-Net at the time of application.

- Pregnant
- Diagnosed with chronic diseases i.e. respiratory diseases, cardiac diseases, metabolic diseases, renal dysfunction, immune insufficiency, systemic steroid administration, mental illness, and psychiatric disability
- Other serious/terminal illness

5. Period of Study in Japan

Doctoral Degree Sandwich Program students

The number of study and its duration will be specified upon commencement of doctoral study based on the consultation between advisors at Host Institutions (HIs) and co-advisors at Japanese Supporting Universities (JSUs). During three (3) years of scholarship period, students are eligible to have either one (1) or two (2) trip(s) to JSU for joint supervision.

Option 1: Long SSJP (Once)

Option 2: Short and Long SSJP (Twice)

In case students choose to have Short-term Study in Japan twice, it is required that one of the two trips must be within 10-30 days and another must be from 30 up to 210 days, 2 application forms are required to be submitted separately.

Integrated Graduate students

During four (4) years of scholarship period, students are eligible to make two (2) one-month visits and one (1) eight-month visit of Short-term Study in Japan, for a total duration of 300 days. There are 3 options of training period available. The decision is, however, based on the consultation between advisors at Host Institutions (HIs) and co-advisors at Japanese Supporting Universities (JSUs):

Option 4: Short-Short-Long SSJP (1+1+8 months)

Option 5: Short-Long -Short SSJP (1+8+1 months)

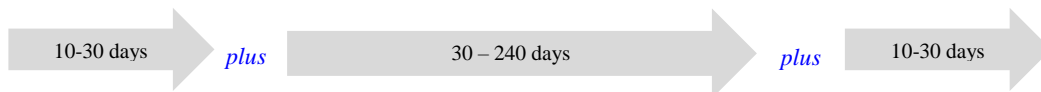


Figure 2: Short-term Study (10-30 days) + Long-term Study (30-240 days) + Short-term Study (10-30 days)

Remark:

Students are not accepted to travel overseas during the stay in Japan under this program as the study period at JSU should be maximized. Unless indispensable for the thesis/degree of completion.

6. Application Procedure

6.1 Short-SSJP (10 - 30 days)

It is the applicant’s responsibility to hold a valid visa in Host Country **until the time the applicant returns from Japan**. The lack of such arrangement may cause refusal of entry to the Host Country. AUN/SEED-Net will NOT bear any cost by such negligent.

11. Information Sharing

To share the information of your visit to Japan with your government and Sending Institution, the applicant is required to contact the focal person of Sending Institution.

12. Remarks

SSJP Program in JFY 2019 is subject to the availability of project budget. Applicants may be asked to cancel a trip or reschedule it due to unexpected circumstances.
